Letter From The Pastor...

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

In my reflections this and next Sunday, I want to tell you about “The Year of Saint Joseph”.

As you may know, last December Pope Francis announced a Year of St. Joseph, in honor of the 150th anniversary of the Saint's proclamation as patron of the Universal Church by Pope Pius IX on Dec. 8, 1870. To mark the occasion, the Holy Father has proclaimed a “Year of Saint Joseph” from December 8, 2020, to December 8, 2021. In a new Apostolic Letter entitled *Patris corde* (“With a Father's Heart”), Pope Francis describes Saint Joseph as a beloved father, a tender and loving father, an obedient father, an accepting father; a father who is creatively courageous, a working father, a father in the shadows. Pope Francis said he was establishing the year so that “every member of the faithful, following his example, may strengthen their life of faith daily in the complete fulfillment of God's will.” Pope Francis said the coronavirus pandemic has heightened his desire to reflect on St. Joseph, as so many people during the pandemic have made hidden sacrifices to protect others, just as St. Joseph quietly protected and cared for Mary and Jesus. “Each of us can discover in Joseph — the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence — an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble,” the Pope wrote. He also said he wanted to highlight St. Joseph's role as a father who served his family with charity and humility, adding, “Our world today needs fathers.” Viva Christo Rey!
