Letter From The Pastor...

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

We continue our reflections on the Holy Mass. Today we continue on the third part which is the Liturgy of Eucharist.

There are many Eucharistic Prayers in use during the Holy Mass, but all contain the same elements:

-*The Epiclesis*. This is when the Priest places his hands over the gifts and calls down the Holy Spirit.

-*The Institution narrative and consecration*. This is the moment when the Spirit and the Word transform the elements from bread and wine into the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ. Now, the Priest relates the drama of the Last Supper, when Jesus made provision for the renewal of His covenant sacrifice through all time. When the Priest speaks the words of institution –“*This is my body... - This is the chalice of my blood...*” he is not merely narrating, he is speaking in *persona Christi* – in the person of Christ, who is the principal celebrant of the Mass. By the sacrament of Holy Orders, a man is changed in his very being; as Priest, he becomes another Christ. Jesus ordained the Apostles and their successors to celebrate the Holy Mass when He said: “*Do this in memory of me*” (1 Cor 1.25). Note, that Jesus commended them to do this and not write this or read this.

-*Anamnesis*; in which the Church fulfilling the command that she received from Christ the Lord through the Apostles, keeps the memorial of Christ, recalling especially His blessed Passion, glorious Resurrection and Ascension into heaven.

-*Offering*; by which, in this very memorial, the Church offers in the Holy Spirit the spotless Victim to the Father.

-*Intercession*; by which expression is given to the fact, that the Eucharist is celebrated in communion with the entire Church, of heaven as well as of earth, and that the offering is made for her and for all her members, living and dead.

-*Doxology*. The end of the Eucharistic Prayer is a dramatic moment. We call it a “doxology”, which is Greek for “word of Glory”. The Priest lifts up the chalice and the host, which he now refers to as Him. This is Jesus, and “*Through Him, with Him, in Him...*” Our “Amen” here should resound; it is traditionally called “The Great Amen”, and this “Amen” is the most important amen during whole Holy Mass. In the fourth century, St. Jerome reported that, in Rome, when the “Great Amen” was proclaimed, all pagans’ temples trembled. To be continued. Viva Cristo Rey!
