## Letter From The Pastor...

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

We continue our reflections on the Holy Mass. Today we continue on the third part which is the Liturgy of Eucharist.

Scholars have noted that the eucharistic Prayer has roots in Jewish table prayers recited at every meal. Near the start of the meal, the father of the family or the one presiding over community would take bread and speak a blessing (*barakah*) which praised God saying, “*Blessed are you Lord, our God, King of the universe, who has brought forth bread from heaven*”. This bread was then broken and given to the participants, and the people began eating the various courses of meal.

When the meal neared its conclusion, the presider prayed a second and longer *barakah* over the cup of wine. This blessing had three parts: 1. Praise of God for his creation, 2. thanksgiving for his redemptive work in the past, and 3. supplications for the future, that God's saving works would continue in their lives and be brought to their climax in the sending of the Messiah who would restore the Davidic kingdom.

**Preface and Acclamation.** The prayer begins with a dialogue between the leader and the assembly. First, the priest greets us with “*The Lord be with you.*” He then asks if we are ready and willing to approach the table and to renew our baptismal commitment, offering ourselves to God: “*Lift up your hearts.*” And we say that we are prepared to do so: “*We lift them up to the Lord.*” We are invited to give thanks to the Lord our God. And we respond: “*It is right and just.*”

This dialogue has remained virtually unchanged for the past 1800 years. In the early 200s, St. Hippolytus' account of the Holy Mass in Rome included the dialogue between Priest and people that enjoins the congregation to “*Lift up your hearts to the Lord*” and “*Give thanks to the Lord our God.*” His contemporary in North Africa, St. Cyprian, records the same dialogue in his description of the liturgy, a dialogue intended to remind Christians that “*wherever your treasure is, there will your heart be also*” (Mt 6:21).

This prayer brings to mind similar exhortation in the Book of Lamentations: “*Let us lift up our hearts and hands to God in heaven*” (Lam. 3.4). But what does it mean to “*lift up*” our hearts?
