Letter From The Pastor...

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

We continue our reflections on the parts of the Holy Mass. We pick up today with a prayer after *Our Father*. Christians can experience fears in life that may cause their hearts to lose the peace of God. We might be anxious about a situation at work, at the parish, in the country, or in our families. We might be afraid of the future or afraid of the suffering. We might be worried about a big decision, about our finances, or about what someone thinks of us. Christians, of course, should give attention to our human responsibilities. But when preoccupations dominate our hearts and cause us to lose our peace, it is a sign that something is wrong spiritually. We are not truly trusting God with our lives. At this moment of the Holy Mass, the Priest prays that Jesus will deliver us from all these anxieties that keep us from experiencing the deep peace he wants to give us. The Sign of Peace. By this sign the Church asks for peace and unity for herself and for the whole human family, and the faithful express to each other their ecclesial communion and charity. The sign may vary, depending on local custom. In some settings, it may involve shaking hands. In others, it might entail bowing one's head or some other sign. The prayer "Agnus Dei" or "Lamb of God" recalls the Passover sacrifice and the "mercy" and "peace" of the new Passover. The priest breaks the bread and put a piece of the host into the chalice to signify the unity of the Body and Blood of the Lord in the work of salvation. It is a simple and at the same time important gesture which is called the conmixtio. Its origins date back to the beginning of Christianity. The Pope celebrated the Holy Mass and sent the Priests to celebrate in the churches on the outskirts of the city. He gave each one of them a small particle of the Eucharist that he had consecrated, and that received the name of fermentum. Each priest, during the celebration of Holy Mass, introduced the fermentum into the chalice as a sign of communion with the Pope. Thus, the Eucharist was made manifest as the sacrament of unity. Later on, another theological meaning was developed. The union of the two species of the consecrated bread and wine, which until that moment were separated, symbolizes the sole, glorious person of Christ, vivified by the Holy Spirit. Viva Cristo Rev!
