Letter From The Pastor...

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

We continue our reflections on the parts of the Holy Mass. We pick up today with a *Communion Rites*. After the prayer “*Agnus Dei*” Priest lifts the host and chalice up and calls out the words of John the Baptism: “*Behold, the Lamb of God...*” (Jn 1.39) And we can only respond in the words of the Roman centurion: “*Lord, I am not worthy...*” (Mt 8.8). Then the Priest prepares himself by a prayer, said quietly, that he may fruitfully receive Christ’s Body and Blood. The faithful do the same, praying silently. Now is time to receive Jesus Christ to our hearts. While approaching to the altar you can tell Him: “*I wish my Lord, to receive You with the purity, humility, and devotion with which your Most Holy Mother received You.*” When you are receiving Holy Communion standing, you have to bow your head before the Sacrament as a gesture of reverence. It is strongly recommended that you receive Holy Communion on the tongue and preferably, kneeling. Our: “Amen” to the minister’s “The body of Christ” means “It is true”. I believe Lord that you are truly present in this host.

We must receive Holy Communion not as “something” in order to receive more graces or a higher place in heaven, but rather as “Someone”, “the Living Christ” Who comes to transform us. We must stand before Christ as we are and ask Him to change us: to help us become better, to become holier, to become more patience, kind, loving, and considerate. Furthermore, we must try to live the Holy Mass throughout the entire day and week; we must faithfully try to live out the “offering of ourselves” what we made.

A common and mistaken trend of our times is to presume that all have the right to approach and partake of the Body and Blood of the Lord and that limiting such a “right” would go against the practice of Jesus Christ, who welcomed all sinners. However, the teachings of the Church have always been clear and based on Scripture. When one receives Holy Communion unworthy, the Sacrament becomes a sacrilege; the spiritual medicine becomes for that person – it is frightful to say – a form of spiritual poison. Viva Cristo Rey!
