#### Letter From The Pastor...

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

Today we conclude our reflections on the parts of the Holy Mass. Last Sunday we reflected on receiving Holy Communion. After Communion, it is convenient to have a time of silence so that both the Priest and the faithful can take advantage of those moments of intimacy with the Lord. To give Him thanks for coming to our hearts in Holy Communion.

<u>Prayer after Communion</u> concludes the Liturgy of the Eucharist. In this Prayer, the Priest asks God that the spiritual effects of the Eucharist be experienced in the lives of the faithful.

The Concluding Rite is the last part of the Holy Mass. It consists of: - brief announcements, if they are necessary; - the Priest's celebrant's greeting and blessing; - the dismissal of the people; - the kissing of the altar by the Priest, followed by a profound bow to the altar by the Priest, and the Altar Servers. On the end of Holy Mass, the Priest says: "Ite, Missa est", which literally means "Go, you are sent". It does not end when we are dismissed by the Priest, it must continue in our daily life. We have offered ourselves to God and now we must live out that offering. After having received the Lord's blessing, and even more so after having received Him in Holy Communion, Christ comes to us, into our life and world, to help us to live out our offering and to help bring Him to the world and the world to Him. Christ tells us: "go in peace!" Yes. We can go in peace because Christ is coming with us to help us live out life. We can go in peace because we will no longer be alone, for Christ will be with us to help us to work; to bear our crosses, our headaches, our heartaches; to fight temptations; to live our Christian life. We can go in peace because, when we are not loved by others, He will love us; slighted by others, He will accept us; discouraged, He will encourage us; dejected, He will lift us up. But, if some people leave Mass right after receiving Communion, do they go in peace? Do they go with Christ's blessings for the whole next week?

Indeed, the Holy Mass makes a difference in our life because it becomes a life in union with Christ. It makes a difference because, like St. Paul said, "It is no longer I who live, but Christ Who lives in me!"
