## Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

During our holy time of Lent, I want us to reflect on seven last words of Jesus Christ from the Cross.

Today we hear His fourth word: *My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?* (Mark 15, 34; Matthew 27, 47). It occurred about the ninth hour after sunrise, or about 3 p.m. Jesus had been in agony on the cross for six hours by this time. Now in this fourth word, we see Jesus examining His relationship with His Father. And this takes a very dramatic turn. We might be wondering about this whole process, this whole sequence of event. In His last night of prayer at the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus was so sure of His Father's love and presence.

To make a very limited attempt to unravel the mystery of this cry, it must be wise to go back to Psalm 22. Close reading of the text gives us a feeling of feebleness- and the reality that God has always been there to rescue us; the idea of persecution- and the reality of God as our shield; and the inescapable presence of tribulations- and the reality that those go through them end up praising God. And in the end, one thing is certain. Those who put their trust in the Lord will eat and be satisfied for dominion belongs to the Lord. But the equally important, but unwritten, reality is this- God may sometimes be silent but He is never absent. Oftentimes, because of our spiritual blindness, we forget and are unaware of this reality.

Something else is noteworthy. Earlier that day religious leaders, clearly rejecting Him as their Savior, had taunted Jesus, going so far as to mock Him with words from Psalm 22, a messianic prophecy. When Jesus later cried out, "*My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me,*" He, too, quoted Psalm 22—the same psalm His tormentors had used! Using this scripture back to them was His rebuttal that they were indeed crucifying the Messiah! He knew this psalm prophesied about Him; and though He anguished over being temporarily forsaken, He knew God would answer.

Let's ask a question about ourselves, though: Has our Father ever asked of us, "My child, my child, why have you forsaken Me?" We all, of course, have abandoned God through our sinfulness. Isn't it time to stop? Viva Cristo Rey!
